CITY-WIDE STREET-SIDE CLEAN UP GOESSEL RESIDENTS ONLY

SATURDAY—JUNE 28 , 2025—7 AM TO NOON

PUT YOUR ITEMS FOR CLEAN-UP AT THE STREET IN FRONT OF YOUR HOUSE BY 7 A.M. ON SAT., JUNE 28TH & WASTE CONNECTIONS WILL COME & PICK IT UP. SEE BELOW FOR ITEMS THAT ARE PROHIBITED

Waste Connections will make one pass thru the city.

Waste Connections asks that all items being collected need to be able to be handled by one or two people safely. General trash, small amounts of bundled brush or limbs, Furniture including, chairs, couches, tables. Appliances including, washers, dryers, dishwashers, microwaves small electrical appliances such as TV’s, computers, mixers, blenders. Patio grills, patio furniture, push lawn mowers (free of gas & oil) and lawn trimmers. Tree limbs and branches must be cut in 3ft. lengths and bundled for easy pickup. Any trash not in the trash cart must be in throwaway containers such as boxes or bags, no more than 30-gallon capacity. No loose trash or debris or no box or bag may exceed 40 pounds in weight.

Here is a list of items NO LANDFILL OR TRANSFER STATION will accept:

Car batteries, oil filters, fluorescent light bulbs, propane tanks, any asbestos materials, explosives, paint (we will take empty & dried up paint cans), no hazardous liquids (such as fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, solvents, diesel fuel, gas, oil, transmission fluid, antifreeze, etc...) and tires. REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS AND AIR CONDITIONERS must be tagged by a technician and must have the appropriate paper work with it in order for Waste Connections to pick it up.

THE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE TRAILER WILL BE LOCATED ON THE PARKING LOT SOUTH OF THE CITY BUILDING FROM 9-11. QUESTIONS? PLEASE CALL THE CITY OFFICE AT 367-8111.
