In the past few years we have had several structure fires where the overhead electrical service going into the building has been worn or ripped loose by the intense wind. This causes the lines to arc where they enter the building and which then ignites the building on fire. This seems to happen more on rural buildings such as barns, out buildings and also on older houses. A quick inspection by a qualified electrician can prevent the loss of a building.
