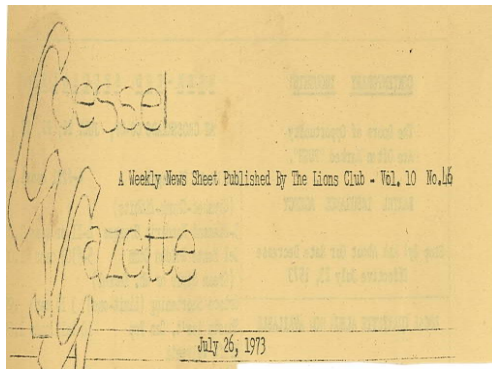

GOESSEL GAZETTE

At one time Goessel had a robust Lion's Club. In 1963 the Lions decided Goessel needed a way to spread local news. They started a one page mimeographed newsletter called the Goessel Gazette. It contained feature articles and was supported by advertising. The editor was Aaron J. Epp. The staff included carriers. Several carriers through the years included Royce Flaming and Anita (Woelk) Goertzen. The first issue came out Sept. 5, 1963. Weekend specials at Crossroads Coop grocery (now Keith's Foods) included bananas for 10¢/lb and cottage cheese 12 oz. for 19¢. LeRoy Ratzlaff had an establishment on the corner of Hwy 15 and 215, a gas station and this was the ad he placed in the first Goessel Gazette: Lee's Hi-Way service, featuring Derby products, minor repairs, lubrication, free advice by appointment.

The first feature article was headlined FOOTBALL COMES TO GOESSEL HIGH. Heretofore football was not included in the sports program at the high school. The roster is not listed but mention was made that the Dad's and their enthusiastic sons met with school officials to prod the program into existence. The first coach was Dewayne Reusser. That fall 31 fellows signed up to play. (the high school enrolled 111 students). Uniforms and other equipment was ordered.

Durham High School was also just starting a program and the first game would be played at Durham on Sept. 27, 1963. The Oct. 17, 1963 Gazette reported the results of that game. At half-time the score was tied at 12-12. Goessel scored well in the second half to win the game 25-12. Go BLUEBIRDS in your 49th season!!!
