### Fuel Pumps:

All 3 pumps are going to be replaced with **New** pumps! (Gas and Diesel)

The 2 Diesel Pumps will be replaced with a 1 Pump unit, Dyed and Clear hoses on each side.

The Diesel card Reader will be removed and you will swipe your card at the pump.

The whole operating system will be replaced, thus giving you faster and error free transactions.

Like all construction work there are delays and at this point we are looking at work beginning here around mid October. Expect the pumps to be out of service for about a week. There will be signs placed at least a week in advance.

### Heritage Lectures Will Focus on Mennonites'

#### Prussia and Russia Experience

“A Long Sojourn in Prussia” and “A Short Sojourn in Russia” are the titles of a morning lecture series at Alexanderwohl Mennonite Church on Saturday, Oct. 11.

Presenter will be Mark A. Jantzen, associate professor of history at Bethel College. The series is sponsored by Mennonite Heritage & Agricultural Museum in commemoration of the 40th anniversary of the museum’s dedication and of the 140th anniversary of Mennonites’ migration from Russia to Kansas.

The first session, “A Long Sojourn in Prussia,” will begin at 9 a.m., followed by a coffee/coffecake break at 10 o’clock. The second lecture, “A Short Sojourn in Russia,” will begin at 10:30 and conclude at about 11:30. Both sessions will be held in the church’s Foundation Room adjacent to the fellowship hall.

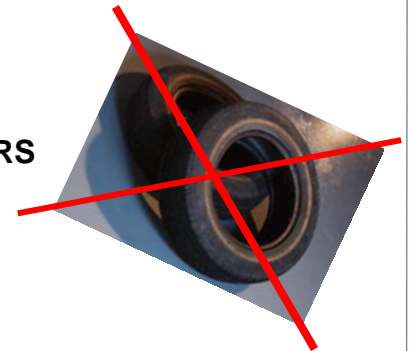
